--Count by 1's and 10's to **100**.

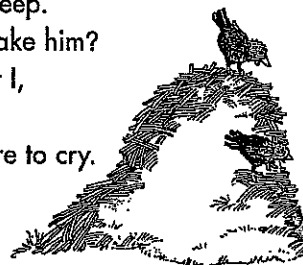
--Count backwards from numbers less than 10 to prepare for subtraction.
