Home Practice Ideas For Feb.

- --Please *read with and to* your child *everyday*.
- --Read a story with your child and have him/her predict what is going to happen at the end before it is shared. Then check how the author decided to end the story.
- --Share a story with your child and have him/her retell it to you. See if he /she can tell you the order of things correctly. Act out the story or do a puppet show about it
- --Count by 1's, 5's, and 10's to 100.
- --Count backwards from numbers less than 10 to prepare for subtraction.
- --Work on the monthly Homework Calendar

Math Games for Kindergarten

Here are some ideas for simple games using number concepts.

BUZZ

This is a counting game in which you and your child take turns counting. Pick a pattern, like counting by 2's, 5's or 10's. Take turns counting but when you come to that number you must say BUZZ instead. For example: Count by 5's = you say 1, your child says 2, you say 3, your child says 4, you say BUZZ, your child says 6 and so on. The faster you can do it the more fun!!

GUESS MY NUMBER

Choose a number and give clues to your child so they can guess what the secret number is! Clues might include things like; My number is between 10 and 30. My number is more than 13. My number is less than 23. My number ends with a 5. My number starts with a 1. Allow children to guess after each clue. Did you guess my number? It was 15.

ONE MORE, ONE LESS

Give your child a number from 1-100 and ask them what number is one more or one less. For example; What number is one more than 97? (98) What number is one less than 54? (53)
